ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES TO SAVE

Here are some additional items you may want to consider to increase your savings even further:

- Upgrade to a programmable or WI-FI enabled thermostat. A new WI-FI thermostat may qualify for a rebate.
- Before you turn on the air conditioner, reduce your need for cooling by using fans and natural ventilation first.
- Weather stripping your door can reduce air infiltration and reduce your heating and cooling costs.
- Add weather stripping to your attic hatch to decrease air infiltration and lower your heating and cooling costs
- Close drapes and shades during the day to keep heat from the sun out of your house.
- Change your furnace filter every three months. Clean filters allow your furnace to operate more efficiently.
- Properly protect your A/C unit during the winter with a cover that does not lock in moisture and keeps debris, weather, and animals out of the unit.
- Cover your windows with Shrink Film Insulator/plastic window sealants that keep cold air out and make heating your home more efficient.
- Sealing and insulating ducts in unconditioned space can reduce your heating and cooling costs
- Caulking windows can help reduce air infiltration and reduce your heating and cooling costs.
- Flush your water heater once per year to maintain operational efficiency
- Washing clothes in cold water can clean clothes just as effectively as hot water in most situations and will save on your water heating costs.
- Consider decreasing your hot water temperature to 120 to reduce your water heating costs
- Pack your refrigerator and freezer full. Less open space in your refrigerator means that there is less air to cool after every time the door is opened.
- When shopping for new bulbs or fixtures look for the ENERGY STAR  label. ENERGY STAR products use one quarter of the energy of traditional bulbs and fixtures.
- Many electronics still draw energy when turned off. Use smart power strips or flip off power strips to reduce these phantom loads.
- Remember to turn off lights when exiting rooms.
- Consider using motion sensors for outdoor lighting.

- Make sure your computer's sleep mode is enabled. The computer will switch to a low-energy mode when not in use.
- Check with your natural gas company to see if they offer any options with gas savings measures. Low-flow shower heads and sink aerators may reduce gas costs from your gas hot water heater.
